

Use the following critical thinking questions to help foster an open, student-led discussion on the theme(s) discussed in this episode of The Harbor.

1. MIKE OPENS THIS EPISODE BY LISTING OUT WHAT HE DID TO BE "A LEADER" IN HIGH SCHOOL: PLAYING ON ATHLETIC TEAMS, GOING ON MISSION TRIPS, AND PARTICIPATING IN EXTRACURRICULAR CLUBS AND ORGANIZATIONS.

What is your definition of a leader? Do you see yourself as a leader? Why or why not?

2. MIKE DESCRIBES A TIME IN COLLEGE WHEN HE WAS CAUGHT OFF GUARD BY A TEAMMATE WHO TOLD HIM HIS ACTIONS WERE INAPPROPRIATE SIMPLY BY SAYING: "WE DON'T DO THAT HERE."

Think of a time when you were made aware that your actions were inappropriate. Did you agree? How did you respond? Did you change your behavior the next time you were in a similar situation? Explain your response.

3. MIKE SAYS, "SOME OF THE MOST INFLUENTIAL PEOPLE IN YOUR SCHOOL AREN'T ACTUALLY THE BEST LEADERS."

Would you say this statement is true for your school? Why or why not?

4. MIKE BELIEVES THAT "LEADERSHIP IS CONTAGIOUS" AND CAN HELP CHANGE THE CULTURE OF A SCHOOL.

Explain what you think he means by this. How can you set a standard so high that others around you will rise to meet it?

5. MIKE OBSERVES THAT HIS TEAMMATE "LIVED BY EXAMPLE" BY BEING HUMBLE, KIND, AND SELFLESS, WHICH HELPED HIM EARN THE TRUST OF THEIR ENTIRE TEAM. MANY OF US TALK A GOOD GAME AND SHOW OURSELVES AS LEADERS ONLINE, BUT OFTEN TIMES, THE REALITY IS DIFFERENT.

Think about how you portray yourself online versus how you live day-to-day. Do you actually live by example? Are you actively showing others what your values are? Do your everyday actions match the person you portray online? Challenge yourself here!
